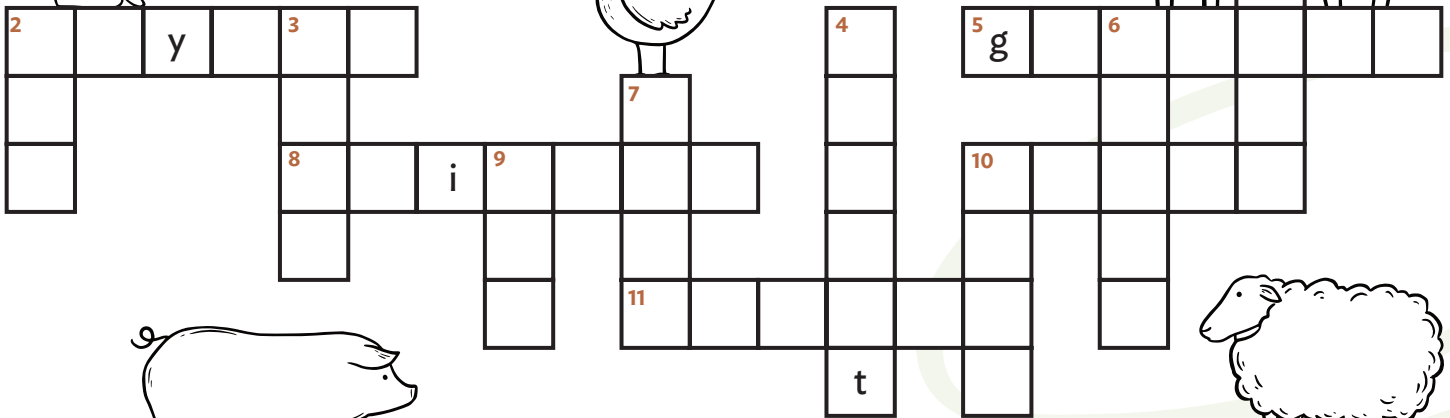
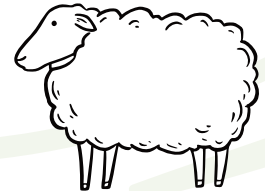
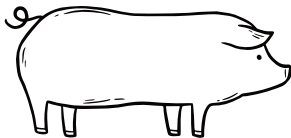
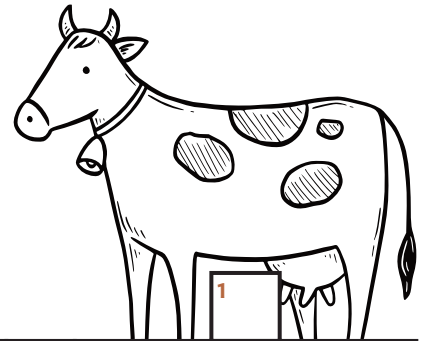
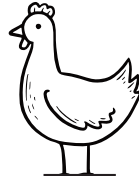


Nevada Animals & Zoonotic Diseases

- This animal is related to wolves and uses 11 different sounds to communicate with its pack.
- What are baby geese called?
- A bird that often lives on a farm and that can lay white, brown, blue, green, and even pink eggs.
- Small bugs that can sometimes be found on pets that could carry the bubonic plague.
- The saliva (or spit) of a rabid animal.

Down

- Swine flu (Influenza A) is caused by a virus in farm animals that like to roll around in the mud.
- This purring, whiskered house pet can sometimes spread an infection called ringworm, which causes circular rashes on the skin. Good hygiene can prevent it from spreading.
- Anaplasmosis is a disease that comes from this small insect that burrows into the skin of people and animals and makes them sick.
- This animal sleeps with its eyes open to protect itself from predators.
- A farm animal that has a woolly coat and rectangular pupils.
- Animal with antlers and is often seen in the forest.
- E. Coli is a type of bacteria that can be passed from this large livestock animal to people.
- This animal lives in the water and uses its fins to swim. It can also carry a bacteria that causes botulism in rare cases.
